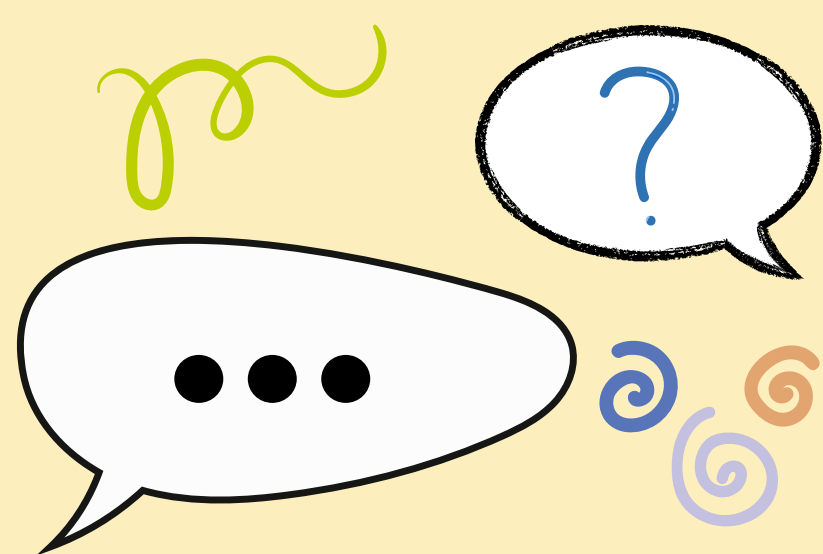


Autistic masking on social networking sites and its relation to wellbeing in emerging adults



About the study

Research has explored the role of masking on mental health, but not much is known about the presence and nature of masking when *online*. We are interested in how **autistic 18–29 year olds** use **social networking sites** and their **experiences of online authenticity and masking**.

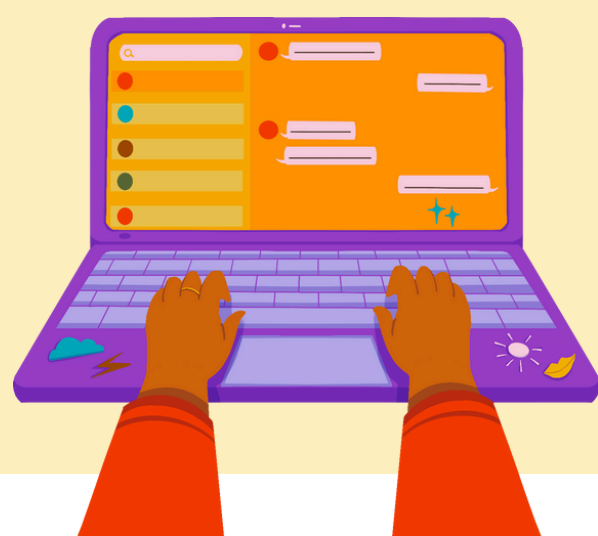


What it involves
