About the study

We're looking for autistic women to take part in a research study exploring what "thriving" means, from your perspective and lived experience.

This study is led by an autistic researcher and aims to centre autistic women's voices to better understand what supports a fulfilling and meaningful life.

What will I be asked to do?

- 1 Take part in a 60–90 minute online focus group.
- 2 Share your experiences and views on what thriving means to you and what enables you to thrive.

We are looking for people who:

- Are aged 16 or over
- Were assigned female at birth
- Do not have a diagnosed intellectual disability
- Are formally diagnosed, currently seeking a diagnosis for autistic spectrum disorder, or self-identify as autistic based on your lived experience
- Live in the UK
- Have access to an internet-connected device

Why should I take part?

- Share your experiences and help shape how thriving is understood in autism research
- Ensure autistic women's voices are heard and represented
- Be part of research designed by and for autistic women
